Daily Tips for Old and New Members

The unhappiest person in the world is the alcoholic who has an insistent yearning to enjoy life as he once knew it, but cannot picture life without alcohol. He has a heart-breaking obsession that by some miracle of control he will be able to do so. Sobriety is the most important thing in your life without exception. You may believe your job, or your home life, or one of many other things come first. But consider, if you do not get sober and stay sober, chances are you won't have a job, a family, sanity, or even life. If you are convinced that everything in life depends on your sobriety, you have so much more chance of getting sober and staying sober. If you put other things first you are only hurting your chances.

- (1) Cultivate continued acceptance of the fact that your choice is between unhappy, drunken drinking and doing without just one small drink.
- (2) Cultivate gratitude you have had the good fortune of finding out what was wrong with you before it was too late.
- (3) Expect as being natural and inevitable, that for a period of time, (and it may be a long one) you will recurrently experience the craving, not for a drink as such, but for the soothing glow and warmth a drink or two once gave you.
- (4) Don't permit yourself to think a drink or two would make some bad situation better, or at least easier to live with. Substitute the thought: "One drink will make it worse, - one drink will mean a drunk."
- (5) Cultivate the enjoyment of sobriety. How good it feels to be free of shame, mortification and self-condemnation. How good it is to be free of fear of the consequences of a drunk just ended, or a coming drunk you have never before been able to prevent.
- (6) Cultivate gratitude. Gratitude that so much can be yours for so small a price. Gratitude that you don't have to drink. Gratitude that A.A. exists, and you found out about it in time. Gratitude that you are only a victim of a disease called Alcoholism, that you aren't a degenerate, immoral weakling, or the self-elected victim of a vice or a person of doubtful sanity.
- (7) Seek ways to help other alcoholics and remember the first way to help others is to stay sober yourself.
- (8) And don't forget that when the heart is heavy and resistance is low, there is much comfort in a true and understanding friend standing by you. You have that friend in A.A.

TRADITION ONE

On Tradition One "Our common welfare should come first; personal recovery depends upon A.A. unity."

Editorial by Bill W. A.A. Grapevine, December, 1947

Each member of Alcoholics Anonymous is but a small part of a great whole. A.A. must continue to live or most of us will surely die. Hence our common welfare comes first. But individual welfare follows close afterward."

Our whole A.A. program is securely founded on the principle of humility--that is to say, perspective. Which implies, among other things, that we relate ourselves rightly to God and to our fellows; that we each see ourselves as we really are--"a small part of a great whole." Seeing our fellows thus, we shall enjoy group harmony. That is why A.A. Tradition can confidently state, "Our common welfare comes first." "Does this mean," some will ask, "that in A.A. the individual doesn't count too much? Is he to be swallowed up, dominated by the group?" No, it doesn't seem to work out that way. Perhaps there is no society on earth more solicitous of personal welfare, more careful to grant the individual the greatest possible liberty of belief and action. Alcoholics Anonymous has no "musts." Few A.A. groups impose penalties on anyone for non-conformity. We do suggest, but we don't discipline. Instead, compliance or non-compliance with any principle of A.A. is a matter for the conscience of the individual; he is the judge of his own conduct. Those words of old time, "Judge not," we observe most literally. "But," some will argue, "if A.A. has no authority to govern its individual members or groups, how shall it ever be sure that the common welfare does come first? How is it possible to be governed without a government? If everyone can do as he pleases, how can you have aught but anarchy?" The answer seems to be that we A.A.s cannot really do as we please, though there is no constituted human authority to restrain us. Actually, our common welfare is protected by powerful safeguards. The moment any action seriously threatens the common welfare, group opinion mobilizes to remind us; our conscience begins to complain. If one persists, he may become so disturbed as to get drunk; alcohol gives him a beating. Group opinion shows him that he is off the beam, his own conscience tells him that he is dead wrong, and, if he goes too far, Barleycorn brings him real conviction. So it is we learn that in matters deeply affecting the group as a whole, "our common welfare comes first." Rebellion ceases and cooperation begins because it must; we have disciplined ourselves. Eventually, of course, we cooperate because we really wish to; we see that without substantial unity there can be no A.A., and that without A.A. there can be little lasting recovery for anyone. We gladly set aside personal ambitions whenever these might harm A.A. We humbly confess that we are but "a small part of a great whole." Bill W. The A.A. Grapevine, December, 1947

Mike B. opened the December 11, 2021, TBAIC Zoom meeting with the Declaration of Unity. Attendees: Mike B., Tom F., Sara R., Rich R., Scott S., Hezekiah D., Kevin, and John T. Mike B. presented the chair report. Mike said he was on vacation and did not attend the December district meeting. However, he heard that the proposed district budget was approved. He also said the area decided to hold an in-person quarterly meeting in January in Sarasota. Mike indicated he planned to attend the meeting and will hand out Grapevine magazines he had received for the October area meeting which was via Zoom rather than an in-person meeting. Mike added that he sent the requested Bridging the Gap business cards to Sara R. and Tracy B. He also said he sent an electronic version of the meeting schedule to Tracy B. John T. asked if there were any questions or comments regarding the November minutes. Nothing was mentioned. The minutes were approved. Scott S. presented the treasurer's report. Pink Can balance is \$11,178.48. Contributions totaling \$356.25 were received during the last month. Expenses paid included: \$50 for Tri-County Central Office storage; \$200 to BizGo for web services; \$149.90 for Zoom account; \$166.62 reimbursement to Tom F. approved at a past meeting; and \$12 for literature. Scott said the detailed treasurer's report will be posted at the TBAIC web site. The report was approved.

INSTITUTION MEETING UPDATES □ Treatment Center Meetings – John T. said no changes in status of meetings. The only update was that Tampa Community Hospital (TCH) detox had still not decided when in-person meetings would be started there and what information regarding the vaccination status of outside attendees would be required. John said two volunteers are ready to chair meetings, but nothing can be done until TCH officials give the OK to proceed. Mike B. said there are currently 3 Zoom meeting chaired by TBAIC members for ACTS Amethyst clients who also attend other Zoom meetings chair by non-TBAIC members. □ Orient Rd Jail – Rich R. said he and Michael P. are conducting meetings on Sundays at 10:30AM. He said a third person wants to volunteer but can only do so if the meeting time is changed which may happen in the future. □ Falkenburg Men's Jail – Mike B. said Buddy H. told him one in person meeting a week was being held on Saturday. □ Falkenburg Road Women's Jail – Sara R. said 4 meetings were held last month and 2 are scheduled for this month. Two new ladies volunteered – 1 has been cleared and approved and approval is pending for the other 1. □ Pasco Women's Jail – John T. said Tracy B. told him still no in-person meetings are being held. She also said she received no calls for the jail's Bridging the Gap program. □ Zephyrhills CI – Tom F. said in-person meetings are being held and going well. He said CI officials required all outside attendees to go through a new orientation presentation. So far, 8 of 10 volunteers have attended. Tom said he will make sure the other 2 attend future presentations. He also said inmates are enjoying the privilege of having coffee at meetings. He added that CI officials approved outside attendees to bring in cookies for the New Years Eve meeting. The reason is to celebrate sobriety anniversaries of several inmates including one man celebrating 32 years sober. □ W T Edwards – Hezekiah D. said in-person meetings are being held. He said he did not attend the meeting two weeks ago due to health reasons or last week due to another program being held at the facility. He said he plans to attend the meeting this Thursday. Bridging the Gap – John T. said Tracy S. told him that she received 6 calls – 4 from Pasco and 2 from Hillsborough. Hezekiah said he had received 1 call. Both Mike and John said they received no calls. Man on the Bed – Tom F. said he received 1 call. The female caller was contacted, and Tom referred the call to a female AA member. **OLD BUSINESS:** Mike said to provide John with updates to the contact list and institution meetings status. He added that facilitators are needed at several locations. Mike said he was still thinking about how to implement the TBAIC Road Show ideas and will discuss that at future meetings. **NEW BUSINESS.** Several items related to using the Pink Can balance were discussed as follows. □ Donating money to

the central office. The consensus was that the best way to support central office was to buy literature from them. □ Committee members survey institutions to identify literature needs even where in-person meetings are not being held. John T. said he would discuss with contacts at ACTS detox, ACT Amethyst and DACCO. Rich R. said that he recently learned that the jail library had two copies of Big Books that had been checked out but not returned. He said he would discuss with the jail coordinator to see if there was a way the committee could donate replacement books and more. John said he would add a note to the committee meeting minutes to describe how committee members can obtain literature for institution meetings (see the below NOTE). □ Donating funds to other districts that had needs but no funds to purchase literature. Scott S. indicated the committee could buy or order books at the central office and have them shipped to other districts. Mike B. said he would ask other district chairs attending the January area meeting if they had needs for literature but no funds available. He said he would bring the results to the February TBAIC meeting for further discussion. □ Ask groups to stop passing the Pink Can. Kevin mentioned that his home group – 5:45 Staying Alive and other groups meeting at Our Place on Lithia-Pinecrest Road had stopped passing the Pink Can and would not start passing it until the Pink Can balance has been reduced. No one objected to that idea and the consensus was that the decision to pass or not pass the Pink Can was up to each group and not for TBAIC to decide. Kevin also said his home group is involved in carrying meetings to the Brandon Real Recovery center and he will contact them about any literature needs. Meeting adjourned with the Responsibility Statement and the Lord's Prayer. The next TBAIC meeting will be Saturday, January 8th, at 9:30 AM via Zoom. **NOTE:** All literature requests require TBAIC approval. After TBAIC approval, the two ways for obtaining TBAIC literature for meetings are as follows. □ Use literature in the TBAIC storage cabinets at the Tri-County Central Office. Ask the office manager and/or attendant for the key to the cabinet if needed. Currently there are a large number of Living Sober and some other AA books and pamphlets atop and inside the cabinets. Please complete the log to show literature taken from the cabinets. □ Purchase literature from the central office and charge it to the TBAIC account. If needed literature is not in the TBAIC storage cabinet, obtain the literature from the central office sales area and ask the office manager and/or attendant to charge the TBAIC account. Obtain a copy of the invoice and provide it to Scott S., the TBAIC secretary, either in person or by leaving a copy in the locking TBAIC cabinet near or through the mail slot in the cabinet.

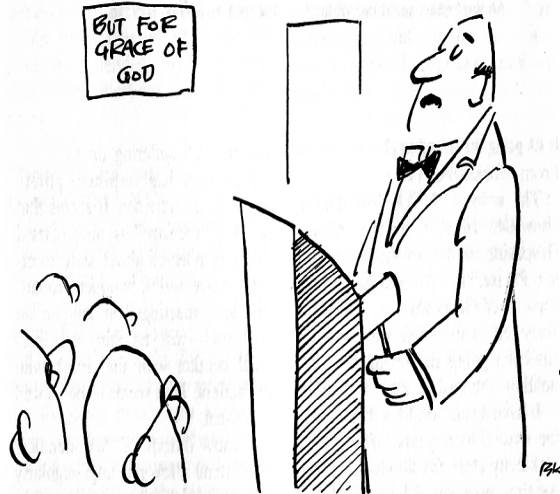

Secretary Report: Tim read the November Secretary report. Motion to approve & seconded.

Treasurers Report: Tim presented the November Treasurer's Report. Contributions in November totaled \$ 4,588.57. This accounts for what 36 Groups or individuals in our area have contributed in November. 2 of those contributions were for \$ 3.00 or less. Included we also received \$ 592.00 from 4 members for the Birthday Club. Our literature sales for November was \$ 5,310.88 This includes sales from A.A. material and non-A.A. material (medallions—etc.) Our total income for November was \$ 9,910.56. Our Total Cost of Goods Sold was \$ 4,018.84. Subtracting the Total Cost of Goods Sold from our November income left us with a Gross Profit of \$ 5,891.72. Our Total Expenses for November were \$ 8,058.03. Subtracting our Expenses from our Gross Profit gave us a Net Income of minus- \$ 2,166.31 for the month of November. Motion to accept report made, seconded and approved.

© Today in December of 2021 COVID has changed the way many groups contribute to the Central Office. Some groups have remained steady in their contributions, some groups have gone to ZOOM, A few ZOOM groups have made some contributions and some groups are Hybrid (in-person & ZOOM), other groups have folded for a lack of a space to have their meeting and some new groups are starting up.. But things are looking up and getting better. It's certainly a time to renew our efforts and practice the meaning of the Serenity Prayer a little bit more. We currently have around 210 Groups in the Hillsborough-East Pasco area with around 524 meetings weekly. Contributions in December totaled \$ 12,504.66. This accounts for what 46 Groups or Individuals in our area have contributed in December. Included \$ 152.00 from 4 members for the Birthday Club. Central Office also received \$ 7,711.45 in Anonymous contributions. Our literature sales for December was \$ 7,016.76. This includes sales from A.A. material and non-A.A. material (medallions—etc.) Our total income for December was \$ 19,521.42. Our Total Cost of Goods Sold was \$ 5,371.53. Subtracting the Total Cost of Goods Sold from our December income left us with a Gross Profit of \$ 14,149.89. Our Total Expenses for December were \$ 7,983.92. Subtracting our Expenses from our Gross Profit gave us a Net Income of plus+\$ 6,165.97 for the month of December. I have to express my Gratitude to not only to the A.A. Groups in our area who continue to support us, but also to those Anonymous A.A. members who generously gave, I believe, from the Heart (and I know who many of you are) to support the Central Office. This December saw us rise from ending another year big-time into the red financially to pushing us up and over and ending the year fairly financially sound. We have a good Prudent Reserve, all our bills keep getting paid, the lights are on, we have a decent amount of literature available, the phones are working and it looks like 2022 just might be a better year to look forward to. I don't want to get all wimpy on you but Bless all of you for another successful year through your support of the Central Office. Thank You!!! tws:)

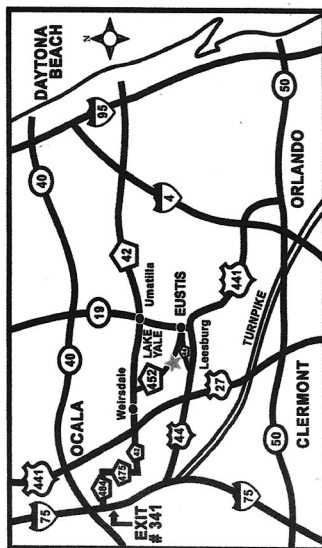
